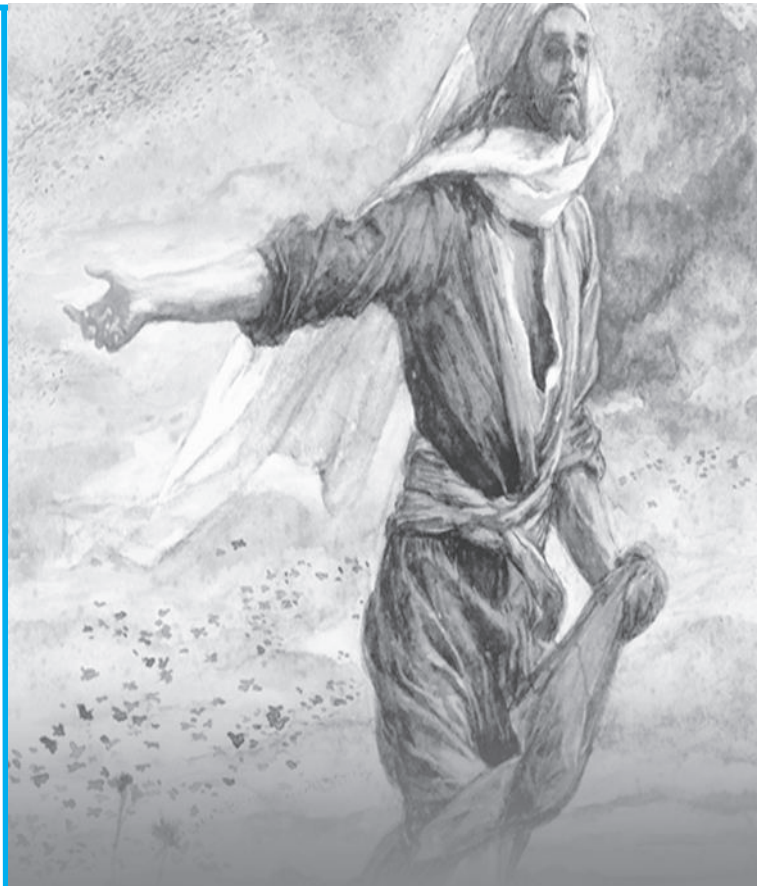

In this week's Gospel, we hear about the parable of the sower. As was commonly Jesus' style, the message he was trying to convey to his disciples in his time and to us in our own time, was done in a very figurative way. The images of seed sown reflect the reality of our lives in God's call and our cooperation with His grace to answer that call. St. Jose Maria Escriva once wrote: "May Our Lord be able to use us so that, placed as we are at all the cross-roads of the world - and at the same time placed in God - we become salt, leaven and light. Yes, you are to be in God, to enlighten, to give flavor, to produce growth and new life. But don't forget that we are not the source of this light: we only reflect it." Made in the image and likeness of God, we have been given an intellect in order to understand God's call, and a will in order to choose to follow it. We are both the soil, and the seed. The Living Word of God - Jesus Christ - has been sown within us in the "field" of our hearts. In order for the seed to grow, we have to take care of it, nourishing it with the graces provided for us in the Sacraments. When the seed grows and continues to produce new life within us, we reflect more and more God's life and love within us. This parable also gives a call for us to be missionary disciples, to go out into the world and witness to God. Once the seed grows within us, and we become more like Jesus, we must become another sower. God, as the original sower of the seed asks us to be like him, to imitate his ways, and to become ourselves his helpers in sowing the seed. We do this by our good example, our fervent prayer for the conversion and healing of others, and by sharing with others the good news that Jesus has called each and everyone of us to himself.

**ABUSE AWARENESS TRAINING
FOR ADULTS**

In order to create a safe environment in the workplace, neighborhood, home and church and to acquaint Archdiocesan personnel with policies and reporting procedures, the Archdiocese provides Abuse Awareness Training for Adults on an ongoing basis. Attendance at the training is mandatory for all adults, over the age of 18 who volunteer in any ministry, in any parish within the Archdiocese of Santa Fe.

Pre-registration is necessary. These workshops are sponsored by the Archdiocese of Santa Fe.

Note: Do not bring children. No one under the age of 18 is allowed in the workshop. If you are late you will not be allowed to enter the training.
